License Agreement #MA-100716 – To enter into an agreement with The Gabriel Foundation for their annual PRCA sanctioned Charity Pro Rodeo. The event is scheduled for 3-days, October 8-10, 2016 with a venue set-up period of 3 days which encompasses both the Grand Arena & The Pavilion Ballroom. #### **CRIA Capital Assets**

In accordance with GASB 34, the Civic-Recreational-Industrial-Authority (referred to as "CRIA") is required to capitalize and depreciate their capital assets. The capital assets net of accumulated depreciation at March 31, 2016 amounted to \$8,769,709. This amount represents the cost of capital assets purchased or constructed over the years at the Industry Hills Expo Center and surrounding areas. No depreciation expense has been recorded in the statement of operations for the period ended March 31, 2016. It is the accounting policy of the CRIA to record annual depreciation expense subsequent to the completion of the June 30, 2016 annual audit.

#### **Capital Projects Operations**

The capital projects fund reflects expenditures for capital improvements and operational costs. Operational costs include Board and staff salaries, professional services and miscellaneous items.
