EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Expo Center:

For the month ended September 30, 2017, the Expo Center generated revenues of \$215,979 and incurred expenses of \$253,269. Transfers from the Capital Projects Fund amounted to \$44,000.

For the year to date ended September 30, 2017, the Expo Center generated revenues of \$597,466 and incurred expenses of \$751,738. Transfers from the Capital Projects Fund amounted to \$140,152. Year to date revenue and expenses are in line with the annual budgeted amounts.

Capital Projects Fund:

CRIA Capital Assets

In accordance with GASB 34, the Civic-Recreational-Industrial-Authority (referred to as "CRIA") is required to capitalize and depreciate their capital assets. The capital assets net of accumulated depreciation at September 30, 2017 amounted to \$8,769,709. This amount represents the cost of capital assets purchased or constructed over the years at the Industry Hills Expo Center and surrounding areas. No depreciation expense has been recorded in the statement of operations for the period ended September 30, 2017. It is the accounting policy of the CRIA to record annual depreciation expense subsequent to the completion of the June 30, 2018 annual audit.

Capital Projects Operations

The capital projects fund reflects expenditures for capital improvements and operational costs. Operational costs include Board and staff salaries, professional services and miscellaneous items.
