BACKGROUND

The Successor Agency to the former Industry Urban-Development Agency ("Agency") is required to adopt a recognized obligation payment schedule ("ROPS") setting forth the nature and amount of all existing Agency recognized obligations (as defined by law). Each ROPS reflect a 12-month interval of obligations. In addition, the Agency is required to prepare a proposed administrative budget and submit to the Oversight Board ("Board") for approval.

Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code ("HSC") 34177.7 (o) (1), the Agency shall submit an oversight board approved annual ROPS to the State Department of Finance ("DOF") and the County Auditor-Controller by February 1.

The obligations of the Agency may include the following:

- a. Bonds;
- b. Loans legally required to be repaid pursuant to a payment schedule with mandatory repayment terms;
- c. Payments required by the federal government, pre-existing obligations to the state or obligations imposed by state law;

- d. Judgments, settlements or binding arbitration decisions that bind the agency;
- e. Legally binding and enforceable agreements or contracts; and
- f. Contracts or agreements necessary for the continued administration or operation of the agency, including agreements to purchase or rent office space, equipment and supplies.
- g. Administrative Cost Allocation of 3% of the total Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund ("RPTTF") received by the Agency.

Resolution SA 2018-19 adopts the proposed administrative budget reflecting the estimated costs to perform the administrative functions for the purpose of winding down the Industry Urban-Development Agency's affairs for the ROPS 19-20 period.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of ROPS 19-20 will facilitate the ability of the Agency to continue payment of the enforceable obligations of the former Industry Urban-Development Agency for the next twelve-month period. The total request funding on ROPS 19-20 is \$166,340,633 and is to be funded from RPTTF, bond proceeds, and other funds such as rental income. The total requested amount includes \$1,721,000 allocated for Agency administrative cost.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Staff recommends that the Successor Agency Board adopt Resolution No. SA 2018-19, approving ROPS 19-20 and Resolution No. SA 2018-20, approving the administrative budget for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 pursuant to AB x1 26 as amended by AB 1484.

RESOLUTION NO. SA 2018-19

A RESOLUTION OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE FORMER INDUSTRY URBAN-DEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF INDUSTRY ADOPTING THE RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2019 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2020 (ROPS 19-20) PURSUANT TO AB x1 26 AS AMENDED BY AB 1484

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code Section ("HSC") 34177(o), enacted by AB x1 26, requires successor agencies to prepare a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule ("ROPS") annually listing the anticipated payments for enforceable obligations to be made by the Successor Agency to the former Industry Urban-Development Agency of the City of Industry ("Agency") and submit to the Oversight Board of the Agency for approval; and

WHEREAS, because Agency previously adopted ROPS 18-19, Resolution No. SA 2018-01, dated January 25, 2018, operative for July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 so that the Agency may continue to meet the Agency's recognized obligations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to HSC Section 34177(o)(1), the Agency is required to prepare and submit a ROPS before each twelve-moth fiscal year period commencing with the period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, to the State Department of Finance ("DOF") and to the County Auditor-Controller ("County") not later than February 1 of each year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to HSC Section 34177, the Agency is legally required to continue to make payments due for enforceable obligations; and

WHEREAS, the SA has prepared a ROPS 19-20 covering the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 as seen in the attached Exhibit A; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, determined and ordered by the Agency Board does hereby resolve, determine, find, and order as follows:

SECTION 1: The Agency Board finds that all of the facts set forth in the Recitals are true and correct, and are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: The Agency staff is hereby authorized to administratively amend the ROPS in order to make revisions to the ROPS that may be requested by the DOF and the County on behalf of the Agency and to take all necessary and appropriate actions to prepare and submit the ROPS, provided, however, that neither such authorization nor such revisions shall be deemed to be, nor are they intended as, an acknowledgement of the validity of AB x1 26 and AB 1484 or such action by the Oversight Board and/or the DOF. The Agency reserves all rights of the Agency to challenge

the validity and/or application of any or all provisions of AB x1 26 and AB 1484 in any administrative or judicial proceeding, without prejudice to the Agency's right to list any such removed item on this or a future ROPS. The Agency reserves the right to pursue any and all appeals and any available legal or equitable remedy provided or available by to obtain the correction of any erroneous decision regarding the ROPS.

SECTION 3: The Agency staff is authorized to include on the ROPS any items which were approved on ROPS I, ROPS II, ROPS III, ROPS 13-14A, ROPS 13-14B, ROPS 14-15A, ROPS 14-15B, ROPS 15-16A, ROPS 15-16B, ROPS 16-17, ROPS 17-18, ROPS 18-19 but not fully expended.

SECTION 4: The Agency hereby adopts ROPS 19-20, in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A, so that the Agency may continue to meet its recognized enforceable obligations, all as required by Health and Safety Code section 34169, during the time period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

SECTION 5: The Agency Secretary shall certify to the adoption of this

Resolution.

SECTION 6: This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Resolution No. SA 2018-19 - A Resolution of the Successor Agency to the Industry Urban-Development Agency ("Agency") to Adopt the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule 19-20 and Resolution No. SA 2018-20 - A Resolution of the Agency to adopt the Administrative Budget for the Twelve-Month Period of July 1, 2019 to June

30, 2020.

BACKGROUND

The Successor Agency to the former Industry Urban-Development Agency ("Agency") is required to adopt a recognized obligation payment schedule ("ROPS") setting forth the nature and amount of all existing Agency recognized obligations (as defined by law). Each ROPS reflect a 12-month interval of obligations. In addition, the Agency is required to prepare a proposed administrative budget and submit to the Oversight Board ("Board") for approval.

Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code ("HSC") 34177.7 (o) (1), the Agency shall submit an oversight board approved annual ROPS to the State Department of Finance ("DOF") and the County Auditor-Controller by February 1.

The obligations of the Agency may include the following:

- a. Bonds;
- b. Loans legally required to be repaid pursuant to a payment schedule with mandatory repayment terms;
- c. Payments required by the federal government, pre-existing obligations to the state or obligations imposed by state law;

- d. Judgments, settlements or binding arbitration decisions that bind the agency;
- e. Legally binding and enforceable agreements or contracts; and
- f. Contracts or agreements necessary for the continued administration or operation of the agency, including agreements to purchase or rent office space, equipment and supplies.
- g. Administrative Cost Allocation of 3% of the total Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund ("RPTTF") received by the Agency.

The attached resolution, SA 2018-19 ("Resolution") approves ROPS 19-20, setting forth the recognized obligations of the Agency and the amount of payments to be made for each obligation from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 and the administrative budget (Attachment). Upon the approval by the SA Board, it is presented to the Oversight Board of the Agency for its approval and forwarded to the DOF, by February 1, 2019, for its review and determination. The Resolution also authorizes Staff to amend the ROPS in order to revise line items as requested by the Oversight Board and/or DOF.

The Agency is entitled to receive 3% of the total RPTTF as an administrative cost allocation. Resolution SA 2018-19 adopts the proposed administrative budget reflecting the estimated costs to perform the administrative functions for the purpose of winding down the Industry Urban-Development Agency's affairs for the ROPS 19-20 period.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of ROPS 19-20 will facilitate the ability of the Agency to continue payment of the enforceable obligations of the former Industry Urban-Development Agency for the next twelve-month period. The total request funding on ROPS 19-20 is \$166,340,633 and is to be funded from RPTTF, bond proceeds, and other funds such as rental income. The total requested amount includes \$1,721,000 allocated for Agency administrative cost.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Staff recommends that the Successor Agency Board adopt Resolution No. SA 2018-19, approving ROPS 19-20 and Resolution No. SA 2018-20, approving the administrative budget for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 pursuant to AB x1 26 as amended by AB 1484.

SECTION 1: The Agency Board finds that all of the facts set forth in the Recitals are true and correct, and are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: The Agency Board hereby approves the Budget, in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A, so that the Agency may continue to meet its recognized obligations, all as required by Health and Safety Code section 34177, during the time period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The Agency reserves the right to further amend the Budget in the future in order to provide an accurate schedule.

SECTION 3: The Agency staff is authorized and directed to enter into any agreements and amendments to agreements necessary to memorialize and implement the agreements and obligations in the Budget herein approved by the Board.

SECTION 4: The Agency Board hereby directs that copies of this Resolution be posted on the Agency's website.
