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City Manager Troy Helling first mentioned that the food banks will still continue, we are currently helping El Encanto with special projects and purchasing of equipment. The IBC and Public Affairs Manager, Sam Pedroza are helping with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

Mayor Cory C. Moss opened the discussion with how are we going to move forward in helping our local businesses? She mentioned that we are not getting good solid information from the legislators. Conversation ensued regarding many topics to include; Lease Assistance Program, Eviction Moratorium, property tax reimbursement, the cost of masks and thermometers, how to better be equipped for re-opening of offices, where to direct our local businesses for testing, ways to partner with PPE providers, what businesses are effected and how many. Getting the IBC, Public Affairs Manager, Sam Pedroza and Elevate involved with a website questionnaire.

It was concluded that locating and obtaining the cost of masks and thermometers was the most important data needed for helping small businesses within the city. The IBC will look into the cost and a process for expediting to businesses at low or no cost. The City will report back with an update on Monday or Tuesday of next week.
