UPDATE ON ACTIVITIES REGARDING COVID-19 ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS 6.3 FOR INDUSTRY BUSINESSES AND RELATED INFORMATION

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Provide direction to Staff.

Executive Director of the Industry Business Council (IBC), Joanne McClaskey provided an update on multiple issues; email response from the questionnaire that was sent to vendors within the city, PPE distribution, testing flyer, vendor list, the roadmap to recovery poster on the website, legal advise hotline, freeway sign, and an overview of the assistance resources links.

Through the IBC, City of Industry businesses may request a RESTART KIT that will provide specific quantities for each product depending on the number of employees and needs for each business. The offer is available as supplies last. Businesses will also be given a vendor list to purchase extra supplies if necessary.

On May 21, 2020 the IBC partnered with Fisher Phillips, LLP to host the webinar titled Beyond the Curve: Bring the Workforce Back to Work. The attendees were provided with key guidelines that employers should follow as they begin to re-open businesses and employees return to work.

Mayor Cory C. Moss, announced the adoption of new business assistance measures aimed at helping local business impacted by COVID-19 to reopen. Several local laws are amended to aid businesses as they reopen, including permitting the expansion of outdoor dining, the banner restriction rules relaxed in all zones of the city, and implemented a new program to reduce business development fees.

Mayor Moss also mentioned on May 22nd, the City of Industry partnered with the Industry Sheriff's Station and the Los Angeles County Fire Department to host a special salute to the healthcare workers at El Encanto Healthcare Facility. The staff at El Encanto had been on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic, ensuring the safety of many of the local community's most vulnerable patients and residents.
