Below for CRIA Board is information related to agreements the Industry Hills Expo Center will enter in the coming months:

License Agreement #OR-030516 – To enter into an agreement with Parelli Natural Horsemanship for a horsemanship seminar. This seminar is scheduled for March 5-6, 2016 in the outdoor training rings. The promoter pays all their fees up front. The base contract is for \$800. This promoter has had many events at our site over the years and pays timely.

Licensee Agreement #MA-091716 – To enter into an agreement with Acorn Engineering Corporation. They are a local business here in the City who has their annual company picnic in the Grand Arena floor for over 1,500 employees and their families in attendance. Contract rental fees are \$1,100. Their company picnic is scheduled for September 17, 2016. This company has been utilizing the venue annually for over 10 years and pays timely.

Licensee Agreement #MA-111816 – To enter into an agreement with Inland Empire Hunter Jumper Association for a 3-day English horse show scheduled for November 18-20, 2016. The event will consist over 125 participants and over 250 spectators each day utilizing Grand Arena and 3 outdoor show rings. This is the promoter's sixth year with the Expo Center. Base Contract is \$3,300. Promoter is a prompt payee.

CRIA Capital Assets

In accordance with GASB 34, the Civic-Recreational-Industrial-Authority (referred to as "CRIA") is required to capitalize and depreciate their capital assets. The capital assets net of accumulated depreciation at December 31, 2015 amounted to \$8,769,709. This amount represents the cost of capital assets purchased or constructed over the years at the Industry Hills Expo Center and surrounding areas. No depreciation expense has been recorded in the statement of operations for the period ended December 31, 2015. It is the accounting policy of the CRIA to record annual depreciation expense subsequent to the completion of the June 30, 2016 annual audit.

Capital Projects Operations

The capital projects fund reflects expenditures for capital improvements and operational costs. Operational costs include Board and staff salaries, professional services and miscellaneous items.

RESOLUTION NO. CRIA 2016-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE CIVIC-RECREATIONAL-INDUSTRIAL AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF INDUSTRY, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. CRIA 2015-01 TO AMEND THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015-16.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. CRIA 2015 – 01 was adopted on May 13th, 2015 approving the Civic-Recreational Industrial Authority Budget for the fiscal year 2015-16; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary due to changed budgetary circumstances to amend Resolution No. CRIA 2015 – 01 to amend the 2015-16 annual budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CIVIC-RECREATIONAL- INDUSTRIAL AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF INDUSTRY DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS.

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Resolution No. CRIA 2015 – 01 is amended as outlined in Exhibit "1 to 3" attached hereto.
