Council Member Ruggles suggested increasing the City Manager's authority to enter into an agreement for professional services to \$50,000.00 rather than the suggested \$10,000.00 to \$25,000.00, of which the Council Members agreed. Josh Nelson said that adjustment could be made in the second reading for the Council to approval at the next meeting.
