Under Section 3, it should read: The City Council hereby declares the Property as surplus, and not necessary for the City's use at this time. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Property shall be made available for lease only, and is not for sale.

Under Section 4, 3rd Sentence, it should read: If and when the property is sold or leased to a purchases/lessee and that purchaser/lessee proposes a use for the Property that requires a discretional permit and CEQA review, that future use and project will be analyzed at the appropriate time in accordance with CEQA.

City Manager Josh Nelson said he had a few changes to the Legal Description as follows: The acres were incorrect at 12.3090, because it included the Indian Hills Parkway. The

total acres should be 11.5208 Acres (501,846 Square Feet) on page 2 of 3 and on page 3 of 3.
