#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### 7. TRES HERMANOS RANCH PUBLIC ACCESS TOUR

RECOMMENDED ACTION: THAT THE AUTHORITY DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION ON A PROPOSED TRES HERMANOS RANCH TOUR STRUCTURE.

Executive Director Montgomery briefed the Board on the staff report, which is on file at the City of Chino Hills City Clerk's office.

Discussion ensued about the logistics of the structured tour that will provide public access with visitors boarding a shuttle vehicle nearby Grand Avenue Park in Chino Hills with stops at three key locations: Arnold Reservoir, the barn and outbuildings, and the scenic Oak Tree at southern end of property. Registration will be required with designated tour times and the number of attendees will be limited to the capacity of shuttles. Staff are expected to serve as docents showcasing the history and key features of the property. The shuttle vehicles transporting the public will need to be capable of navigating through the traverse roadways.

Director Marquez inquired about the number of spots available for the structured tour. Executive Director Montgomery responded they anticipate three shuttles every 90 minutes and depending on the level of interest, additional tours could be scheduled. The proposed timeline will be in late August or early September.

Administrative Director Fox noted that the number of passengers per shuttle is anticipated to be 25 per vehicle totaling 75 passengers per tour and emphasized reservations will need to be made in advance. As part of the reservation process, there will be information stating that there will be no Americans with Disability Act (ADA) accommodations as the tour may include hazardous terrain and wildlife.

Director Chou asked if the tour will be limited to only residents of the three cities with an allocated number per city. Executive Director Montgomery responded it will be up to the Board.

Administrative Director Fox stated that the tour will run similar to those that have been conducted for City officials where you can get off the shuttle at each stop and take photos.

Vice-Chair Rogers and Director Moss recommended having Paul Spitzzeri serve in some capacity of the tour to provide historical information.

Jim Gallagher, Chino Hills resident, spoke in favor of the structured tours, and recommended local historian Paul Spitzzeri and a representative from Hills for Everyone be a part of the process. Lastly, he stated a lottery system for registering would be the fairest.

Melanie Schollterback, representing Hills for Everyone, spoke in support of the concept but stated she is concerned that public access could be detrimental to preserving the natural resources of the property, which are still unknown. Lastly, she urged an evaluation of the property, suggested seeking grant funding, recommended limiting the tour frequency, and only allowing visitors to tour the property one-time.

Following discussion, a motion was made by Director Moss and seconded by Director Chou to bring this item back to the Board laying out a formalized process that will include costs. Motion carried by electronic vote 5-0-2 as follows:

#### Subject: Public Access Tour of Tres Hermanos Ranch

Recommendation:

Authorize Tres Hermanos Conservation Authority staff to conduct a public access tour of the Tres Hermanos Ranch.

#### Background/Analysis:

At the June 14, 2023, Tres Hermanos Conservation Authority (Authority) Board Meeting, the Board directed staff to develop a detailed proposal for a public tour of the Tres Hermanos Ranch (Ranch) property. The following proposal includes the proposed event date, tour structure, staffing needs and associated budget requirements.

Staff proposes that a free chaperoned tour of the Ranch occur on September 23, 2023, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This date was selected to ensure shuttle transportation and adequate staffing were available from Authority member agencies to support the event. Four 25 participant tours will be offered to accommodate a total of 100 participants. Tours will originate at the Diamond Bar Center and last approximately 1.5 hours. Participants will board one of two 25 passenger shuttles leaving hourly at 9:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 12:00 p.m.

Tour participants will visit the portion of the Ranch south of Grand Avenue. Tour guides on the shuttles will provide information about the Authority, the property's history, and answer general questions. The tour will include stops at the Arnold Reservoir, residence/barn, and Majestic Oak. Docents and/or staff will be located at each stop to present exhibits, point out notable features, and provide additional information about the property. Tour participants will be allowed to briefly exit the shuttle at each site for approximately 15 minutes to take pictures and interact with exhibits and docents.

Participants will register via the Authority's website and must fill out a form that includes preferred tour times. Participants under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Registration will be on a "first-come, first-served" basis. Reasonable accommodations cannot be made for this activity under the American with Disabilities Act due to transportation limitations and due to the tour occurring on a working ranch in a natural and unimproved setting without improvements, sidewalks, paths and other amenities. A liability waiver

indemnifying the Authority and member agencies from any liability is required and included in the registration form.

Event staff are needed to assist with set-up, check-in, tours, tour stops, and general support/site security. Staffing will be provided by the Authority member agencies Chino Hills, Diamond Bar, and City of Industry. Staff also intends to consult and involve subject-matter experts such as local historian Paul Spitzzeri on developing the cultural and natural history program elements of the tour.

#### **Budget**

The Authority's staff estimates that the tour will cost approximately \$5,000. Transportation will be provided by two shuttles for approximately \$3,000. Staff proposes to provide participant with giveaways to commemorate the event. Giveaways could include an Authority logo pin, bag, and/or water bottle. The estimated cost for miscellaneous items such as website registration modifications, displays, brochures, trash containers, and refreshments for staff and participants is \$1,000.

Fiscal Impact:

The Authority Fiscal Year 2023/24 budget does not include specific funding for the proposed event. However, sufficient funding exists in other program areas for the budget to absorb the proposed expenses; therefore, a budget amendment is not requested at this time. Authority staff will evaluate if a budget amendment is needed to cover these costs during the mid-year budget review process.
