PRESENTATIONS

Senator Bob Archuleta came to address the City Council and said the City of Industry is recognized as one of the best cities in California and came to honor and acknowledge the Sheriff Department. Josh Nelson said he saw a bus on the freeway and noticed that the only omissions were steam and water. This plant was primarily built to serve the state of California.

City Manager Josh Nelson stated that he and Planning Chair, Jacob Coretez, attended the 2023 League of California Cities Annual Conference and Expo in Sacramento last week. We were up there within a 36-hour turnaround time, and we were able to return for the IBC Luncheon. Good to see everyone there and we were able to sit in on some good sessions.

CITY COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS

Council Member Michael Greubel mentioned attending the BMX event at the Expo Center on September 22nd to 24th. It was an amazing event, it was packed and everyone had a great time. Council Member Radecki added that he was pleasantly surprised at the event and how well it was received. Mayor Moss said she received incredible feedback. BMX was very happy with the staff and the cleanliness of the facility, and everyone really loved the event.

Mayor Moss also mentioned that the Rodeo is this weekend with dinner on Friday night and the rodeo on Saturday and Sunday. Also, it is Mark Radecki's birthday this Friday, September 22nd. Remember the Terror Trails event is coming up on October 20th and 21st, 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
